

Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord or Palm Sunday is the commemoration of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem that takes place about a week before his Resurrection (Easter)


Jesus entered

DONKEY,
which according
to the Eastern
tradition is an
animal of peace.
This reminds us
that Jesus is the
Prince of Peace,
not a war-waging
king.





Traditionally, before the beginning of Lent the following year, the palms are collected, burned to a fine ash.

The ashes are blessed and used for the Ash Wednesday liturgy.



Why do we wave palms?

According to the Gospels, when Jesus rode into Jerusalem, crowds greeted him by waving palms and covering his path with small branches of trees

Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord—the King of Israel!
